

BREAKING NEWS – STRIKE GOING AHEAD



StarTrack has lost its attempt to prevent tomorrow's 24-hour strike. The action will go ahead as planned from midnight tonight.

Despite never before raising it as an issue, StarTrack this week made a cynical application to the Fair Work Commission (FWC) to have the action terminated or postponed for four months, arguing that it would somehow endanger lives. The TWU has always made it clear that the strike would not interfere with urgent medical supplies.

This was insulting to the StarTrack TWU members who would never risk the community and have worked so hard despite numerous dangers throughout the pandemic.

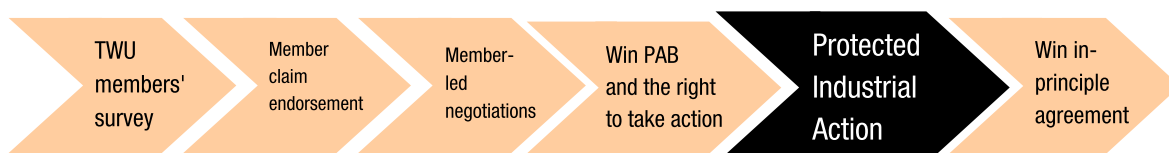
The FWC agreed with the TWU and the 24-hour strike will go ahead in all sites across Australia from midnight tonight.

For the very small number of workers who may need to assist with urgent medical supplies, your delegates will confirm whether you will be required or not. Unless told otherwise, assume you can strike.

Startrack management should spend less time on stunts and less money on lawyers, and get back to finishing this EA negotiation.
