



SECOND FEDEX STRIKE TO GO AHEAD

1AM MON 25 OCT–1AM TUES 26 OCT

After your delegates endorsed a second 24-hour Australia-wide FedEx strike, we made significant progress with the company on your job security claims. In a sign of good faith strike notifications were withdrawn for Thursday 21 October. But FedEx's response was to claim it had no authorisation to move on the offer that has been rejected since May, and ask for a further meeting.

To knowingly come to a bargaining meeting with no change to a position that had been constantly rejected and no authority to negotiate showed a lack of good faith by FedEx.

We will meet again with FedEx on Thurs 21 Oct and have made it clear it's time for FedEx to make a serious offer, or strike action is on the cards.
