



SECOND STARTRACK STRIKE TO GO AHEAD

After your delegates endorsed a second 24-hour Australia-wide StarTrack strike, we have made significant progress with the company on your job security claims. But StarTrack has still not come to the table on several of our key claims, and **your delegates have endorsed a strike on Thurs 21 Oct from midnight to midnight.**

The key issues you're facing with job security have been felt all around the road transport industry - only recently we've seen Toll and FedEx walk off the job for their own national strikes. **BevChain and FedEx have also notified strike action for this week, and we are preparing for an industry stoppage if the companies don't settle the outstanding issues.**

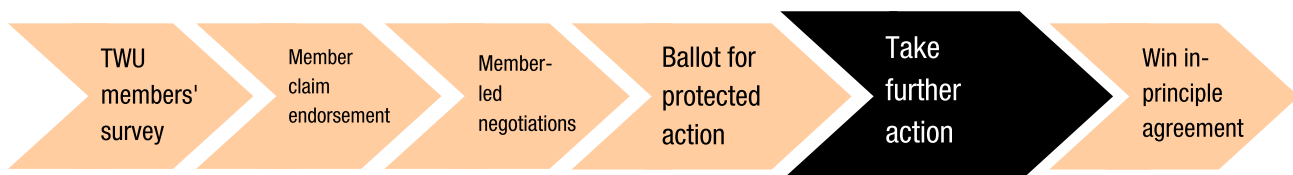
Because of your strong first action, StarTrack has already moved significantly on your job security claims.

KEY WINS

- ✓ Commitment to stronger auditing provisions and greater transparency around outside hire
- ✓ Full utilisation provisions
- ✓ Preventing the use of outside hire to reduce overtime
- ✓ Labour hire casual conversions

There are still outstanding issues that StarTrack must resolve. The company must now come to the table with better outcomes on **contracting out protections**, and moving to a **single strong agreement** with a **common expiry date** and **stronger dispute resolution** provisions.

Now is the most critical time in our fight. You've made it clear you're willing to take further action unless StarTrack comes to the table now with a fair offer. Let's keep standing together and secure the best possible agreement.
