



# ROLLING STOPPAGES RESCHEDULED FOR MONDAY 22 NOVEMBER

While all seven other major transport companies have reached agreements with workers, FedEx has still refused to come to the table with a fair offer.

FedEx made \$18 million a day in 2020 from your hard work in the middle of a pandemic. But still the company is denying you the job security and fair pay you deserve.

We've listened to members in yard meetings across the country over the last week, and as a result your delegates have endorsed resuming rolling stop-work actions across the country if FedEx fails again to come forward with a fair offer. The staggered strikes will each be four hours across three days, with NSW actions to take place Monday 22 November. Each yard's actions are below.
