

UPDATE ON QANTAS COURT CASE

The High Court has invited both parties to make submissions as to whether or not Qantas should be granted leave to appeal, following two Federal Court rulings against them.

The special leave hearing is listed for Fri 18 November.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

This does not mean the case will progress to the High Court.

At the special leave hearing, lawyers from both sides of the case will give legal arguments as to whether or not the case should be heard in the High Court.

Based on this hearing, the High Court will decide whether to grant Qantas special leave to appeal.
