BARGAINING BEGINS AT STARTRACK



Your delegate-led TWU national committee met with StarTrack management representatives in Sydney on 27-28 August to kick off the bargaining process for your replacement Enterprise Agreement.

TWU LOG OF CLAIMS: WHAT MEMBERS WANT

Your Committee provided a summary of the log of claims which includes, but is not limited to:

- **▶** One national agreement
- Year 2026 expiry
- ▶ 15% superannuation
- Job security provisions
- Improved induction rights
- Improved consultation rights
- Improved redundancy rights
- Improved community leave provisions

 E.g. Parental leave, Cultural and Religious leave, Family and

 Domestic Violence leave
- New starters training and development scheme.

- **▶** Improved leave entitlements
- **▶** BlueCard renewal after 5 years
- Improved Comcare processes
- ▶ Wages and allowances increase 5% (back paid to 1st Sept 2024), 3.5% (Sept 2025) underpinned by CPI whichever is the greater.
- Local claims
- **▶** Delegate release for campaign purposes
- Women's Advocate provisions
- Mental health first aid training through the Steering Healthy Minds Program
