

NOT GOOD ENOUGH DNATA



Last week after urgent discussions with delegates, your member-led bargaining team put a revised claim to dnata management calling out their shoddy behaviour around settlement and setting out the following areas that needed to be improved:

- Improved pay
- Fair overtime payments and shift allowances
- Maintain nominal expiry date of 30 June 2026
- Backpay

dnata fails to respond

dnata failed to meet its response deadlines and then sent an offer through that was unanimously rejected by delegates for falling short of what was needed and for still trying to divide the workforce across states.

Fair Work Commission

Instead of working through a pathway to settlement, dnata made an application to the Fair Work Commission for a bargaining dispute. Your representatives will attend the FWC on Tuesday 21 February and will report back. We will make the case for the outstanding items and hopefully the FWC can assist in moving dnata to a reasonable settlement.
